**CALIFORNIA CATHOLIC CONFERENCE OF BISHOPS' STATEMENT  
ON IMMIGRATION REFORM**

*And who is my neighbor? (Luke 10:29)*

Recent news stories have highlighted the polarization that the issue of immigration has caused in our state and our nation. Although it is apparent that our immigration policy needs reform, we must not forget that virtually all immigrants to this country -- both documented and undocumented -- are here in search of jobs and opportunity for themselves and their families.

In California, immigrants live among us. They serve us in our restaurants and hotels, clean our homes, harvest our produce, tend to our yards, and provide us with technical expertise and factory labor. Many are entrepreneurs creating employment opportunities for others. Their children go to our schools. Their families go to our Churches. They are our neighbors.

We recall Christ's teaching parable of the Good Samaritan which he offered in response to the question: And who is my neighbor? Jesus made the Samaritan -- who was looked upon as an unholy outcast and foreigner -- the model because he came to the aid of the injured man who was a stranger to him. Now is our chance to come to the aid of those among us who come from a foreign land. Now is our chance to care about the strangers whom Jesus called our neighbors!

" 'I was a stranger and you welcomed me' (Matthew 25:35). Today the illegal migrant comes before us like that 'stranger' in whom Jesus asks to be recognized. To welcome him and to show him solidarity is a duty of hospitality and fidelity to Christian identity itself." - Pope John Paul II, *Annual Message for World Migration Day, 1996*.

We understand the polarization and frustration over this issue because the status quo serves neither the immigrant nor the citizenry well. For that reason we call on people of faith to welcome the strangers among us as our neighbors and we implore our national legislators to give us a law that reforms immigration in a way that protects human dignity and promotes the common good. In light of the Gospel we call for an answer that is humane, realistic and responsible while also serving our nations' economic and security needs.

Specifically we call for:

- ♦ Reform that includes earned legalization for the undocumented and their families, a temporary worker program, and timely family reunification policies
- ♦ Restoration of due process protections for immigrants
- ♦ Policy directions that address the root causes - so that migrants can remain in their home countries and support themselves and their families
- ♦ Reform that does *not* include sanctions for those who provide humanitarian aid for the undocumented.

We expect our public officials to work together in a bipartisan fashion to create a new immigration system which respects our common humanity, reflects the values of fairness, compassion and opportunity and recognizes that we *are* a nation of immigrants.

**DECLARACIÓN DE LA CONFERENCIA DE OBISPOS CATÓLICOS DE CALIFORNIA  
SOBRE LA REFORMA DE INMIGRACIÓN**

*¿Y quién es mi prójimo? (Lucas 10:29)*

Algunos artículos noticiosos recientes han puesto de relieve la polarización que el tema de la inmigración ha provocado en nuestro Estado y en nuestra nación. Aunque es aparente que nuestras políticas de inmigración necesitan reformarse, no debemos olvidar que virtualmente todos los inmigrantes de este país (tanto los que tienen documentos como los indocumentados) están aquí porque vinieron en busca de empleo y mejores oportunidades para ellos y sus familias.

En California, los inmigrantes viven entre nosotros. Ellos nos atienden en nuestros restaurantes y hoteles, limpian nuestras casas, cosechan nuestros productos agrícolas, cuidan de nuestros jardines, y nos proporcionan sus conocimientos técnicos y su mano de obra en la fábricas. Muchos son empresarios que crean oportunidades de trabajo para otras personas. Sus hijos asisten a nuestras escuelas. Sus familias van a nuestras iglesias. Ellos son nuestros prójimos.

Recordamos la enseñanza de Cristo en la parábola del buen samaritano, la cual ofreció como respuesta a la pregunta: ¿Y quién es mi prójimo? Jesús hizo que el samaritano, quien era visto como un desterrado impío, representara un ejemplo a seguir porque ayudó al hombre lesionado, quien era un forastero para él. Ahora tenemos la oportunidad de ayudar a aquellos entre nosotros que vienen del extranjero, ¡Ahora tenemos la oportunidad de interesarnos por los forasteros que Jesús llamo nuestros prójimos!

" 'Era forastero y me acogiste' (Mateo 25:35) Hoy el migrante ilegal se nos presenta como ese *forastero* en quien Jesús pide ser reconocido. Acogerlo y ser solidario con el es un deber de hospitalidad y fidelidad a la propia identidad de cristianos". - Papa Juan Pablo II, *Mensaje anual para la Jornada Mundial de Emigrante, 1996*.

Entendemos la polarización y la frustración en relación a este tema porque el estado de las cosas, en este momento, no favorece al inmigrante ni a los ciudadanos. Por ese motivo, hacemos un llamado a las personas de fe para que acojan a los forasteros entre nosotros como a nuestros prójimos e imploramos a los legisladores de nuestro país que nos den una ley que reforme la inmigración, de tal manera que proteja la dignidad humana y promueva el bien común. A la luz del Evangelio, pedimos una respuesta que sea humana, realista y responsable, y que a su vez también sea adecuada para las necesidades económicas y la seguridad de nuestra nación.

Específicamente pedimos:

- ♦ Una reforma que incluya la legalización para los indocumentados acreedores a ella y sus familias, un programa de tarabajadores temporales, así como políticas oportunas de reunificación familiar
- ♦ El restablecimiento de las garantías procesales para los inmigrantes
- ♦ Directrices en torno a políticas que ataquen las causas principales en su raíz, para que los inmigrantes puedan permanecer en sus países de origen y tengan la posibilidad de mantenerse a si mismos y a sus familias
- ♦ Una reforma que *no* incluya sanciones contra aquellos que provean ayuda humanitaria a los indocumentados.

Esperamos que nuestros funcionarios públicos laboren juntos de una manera bipartidaria para crear un nuevo sistema de inmigración que respete nuestra humanidad común, refleje los valores de la imparcialidad, la compasión y la oportunidad y que reconozca que *somos* una nación de inmigrantes.

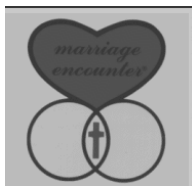
