THE ADVENT WREATH



Many people know the popular symbols and customs of Advent, such as the **Advent wreath**, but do you know their meanings and why we have them?

The Advent wreath is traditionally made of evergreen branches formed into a circle with 4 candles.

- * The evergreen circle is a symbol of eternal life.
- * Green from the evergreen is considered a symbol of hope.

The Advent Candles are usually comprised of three purple candles with one rose or pink. The candles recall the weeks that pass until Christmas.

- * Purple candles symbolize waiting, also penitential but not in the same way as Lent.
- * Rose or Pink is used on the third Sunday of Advent to symbolize rejoicing, since the Third Sunday of Advent is referred to as Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday.
- * They are lit, light used as a symbol of Christ being the light of the World coming through the darkness.

Sometimes a white candle is placed in the middle, people use when lit as the representation of Christ entering the world.

Procesión y Misa de Guadalupe Domingo 5 de diciembre



La Arquidiócesis de Los Ángeles será la sede de la 90 procesión y Misa anual en honor a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe que tendrá lugar en el Este de Los Ángeles, el domingo 5 de diciembre. El tema de este año es "*Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe: Siempre adelante en misión y esperanza*", en conmemoración del Año jubilar especial que celebra el 250 aniversario de la Misión San Gabriel Arcángel, la iglesia fundadora de la Arquidiócesis. Las festividades darán comienzo a las 10:30 am en la esquina de Cesar Chávez Avenue y Ford Boulevard, con una procesión de carros alegóricos, grupos de danzas indígenas, mariachi y fieles de toda la Arquidiócesis. Se otorgarán premios a los carros alegóricos participantes que mejor representen el tema de este año, en función de la creatividad general y de la belleza en la presentación del carro. La procesión concluirá en el Estadio del Colegio del Este de Los Ángeles a la 1:00 pm con una Misa presidida por el Arzobispo Jose H. Gomez y concelebrada por los obispos auxiliares y sacerdotes de toda la Arquidiócesis. Todos son bienvenidos a ese hermoso e histórico tributo a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe y a san Juan diego.

Guadalupe procession & Mass Sunday, December 5th

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles will host the 90th annual Procession and Mass in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe in East Los Angeles on Sunday, December 5th. This year's theme is "*Our Lady of Guadalupe: Always Forward in Mission ad Hope*," in commemoration of the special Jubilee Year celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the Mission San Gabriel Arcángel, the founding church of the Archdiocese. The festivities will begin at 10:30 am at the corner of Cesar Chavez Avenue and Ford Boulevard with a procession featuring floats, indigenous dance groups, mariachi and faithful from throughout the Archdiocese. Prizes will be awarded to participating floats that best represent this year's theme, based on overall creativity and beauty of the float's presentation. The procession will conclude at the East Los Angeles College Stadium at 1:00 pm with a Mass presided by Archbishop Jose H. Gomez and concelebrated by the auxiliary bishops and priests from throughout the Archdiocese. All are welcome to this beautiful and historic tribute to Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego.



November 28, 2021 First Sunday of Advent

How forcefully today's scriptures challenge us to attend to the ominous nature of the Kingdom's definitive in-breaking! The call echoes through Jeremiah's prophecy: "In those days, in that time" and in Paul's letter: "at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. Amen." The theme intensifies toward a crescendo in Luke: "there will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth . . . dismay and perplexity." People will be scared to death—literally—"in anticipation of what is coming upon the world," as "seas and waves roar" and "the powers of heaven will be shaken." And all of this will be just a prelude to "the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory." In the face of this "awful" (that is, filled-with-awe) ending, Jesus warns his disciples to guard against two equally debilitating extremes, both of which seem to be trademarks of our contemporary culture: deadening diversion on one hand, and frantic anxiety on the other.



28 de noviembre de 2021 Primer Domingo de Adviento

Con qué fuerza las Escrituras de hoy nos desafían a prestar atención a la naturaleza inquietante de la irrupción definitiva del Reino. La llamada resuena en la profecía de Jeremías: "En aquellos días, en aquel tiempo" y en la carta de Pablo: "en la venida de nuestro Señor Jesús con todos sus santos. Amén". El tema se intensifica con aumento en Lucas: "habrá señales en el sol, la luna y las estrellas, y en la tierra . . . consternación y perplejidad". La gente estará muerta de miedo—literalmente—"en previsión de lo que vendrá sobre el mundo", ya que "rugirán los mares y las olas" y "las potencias del reino serán sacudidas". Y todo esto será el preludio de que "el Hijo del hombre vendrá en una nube con poder y gran gloria". Ante este final "asombroso" (es decir, lleno de estupefacción), Jesús advierte a sus discípulos que se cuiden de dos extremos igualmente debilitantes, que parecen ser marcas registradas de nuestra cultura contemporánea: la diversión mortífera, por un lado, y la ansiedad frenética, por otro.

PREPARATION FOR THE END-TIMES

In light of these predictions of frightening end-times, Jesus advises us to embrace his three-fold "Preparation for the End Program": (1) "Beware!" that is, be aware of what really matters, life's true priorities. (2) "Be vigilant at all times," that is, watchful for Christ's coming not only at the end but in the meantime, in family and neighbor, friend and stranger. (3) Above all, "pray." Prayer, communion with God, will help us to remember that for faithful disciples, The End of this world—or our own lives, whichever comes first—will be The Beginning of a joy no one can take from us, fullness of life that will never end. How lovely if this Advent's renewal prepared us to look forward to the moment of Jesus' coming—in his glory or our death—not as a cataclysmic disaster, but as a reason for which to "stand erect and raise (our) heads (in joyful expectation) because (our) redemption is at hand."

PREPARACIÓN PARA EL FIN DE LOS TIEMPOS

A la luz de estas predicciones del aterrador final de los tiempos, Jesús nos aconseja adoptar su triple "Programa de preparación para el final": (1) "¡Cuidado!", es decir, ser conscientes de lo que realmente importa, las verdaderas prioridades de la vida. (2) "Velen en todo momento", es decir, estén atentos a la venida de Cristo no sólo al final, sino mientras tanto, en la familia y en el prójimo, en el amigo y en el extranjero. (3) Sobre todo, "reza". La oración, la comunión con Dios, nos ayudará a recordar que, para los discípulos fieles, el Fin de este mundo —o de nuestras propias vidas, lo que ocurra primero— será El Inicio de una alegría que nadie podrá quitarnos, la plenitud de la vida que nunca terminará. Qué bonito sería que la renovación de este Adviento nos preparara para esperar el momento de la venida de Jesús —en su gloria o en nuestra muerte— no como un desastre cataclismo, sino como un motivo por el que "estar erguidos y levantando (nuestras) cabezas (en alegre expectación) porque (nuestra) redención está cerca".

Procession

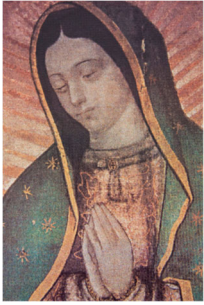
"The Mass is ended, go in peace." At the beginning of Mass, the ministers entered in solemn procession, an emblem of the diverse community that comes together around the altar each week to celebrate the Eucharist. As Mass ends, another procession forms, and the ministers go forth from the church. This concluding procession also acts as an emblem of the entire assembly, who, nourished by the Eucharist, will now go forth to our scattered homes and places of work to be a transforming leaven of the gospel in the world. At the beginning of Mass, the priest kissed the altar as a sign of greeting, a gesture of reverence for Christ. Now, the priest reverences the altar again, this time in a gesture of farewell. We gather our things and go forth as we entered—but not quite. Through our celebration of the Eucharist, we have renewed our commitment to service of Christ our King, and we go forth nourished, strengthened, renewed—changed.

The Lord we encounter in the Church, above all in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, sends us forth from there to be missionaries of the Gospel.
