The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

A child's first words are usually a source of excitement and joy for family members. Today we hear the first words of Jesus in the Gospel according to Luke. And they are challenging ones. "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" The words *astounded*, *astonished*, and *great anxiety* are used to describe Jesus' extended visit to the Temple. How familiar those emotions are to most parents! Had Jesus' parents forgotten the angel Gabriel's words or the prophecy of Simeon? In Luke's Gospel this passage foreshadows Jesus' final journey to Jerusalem where he will experience his own Passover and again be "lost" for three days. The story of Hannah in the first reading confirms the need and nature of trusting in God's activity in our lives. It seems clear that faithful attention to a family's spiritual life is no guarantee that life will be free from hardship.

EMMANUEL: GOD IS WITH US

Could Tolstoy have gotten it wrong when he wrote that all happy families are alike and that unhappy families are each unhappy in their own way? It seems that the opposite is equally true. Because happy families foster the unique talents and interests of each member, each person shines according to their own lights. A happy family's faith, goals, and challenges will be uniquely their own. Unhappy families, on the other hand, might look very similar in their woundedness, their fears and confrontations, and their tendency to give negative interpretations to another's actions.

It is tempting to conclude that family life today is more problematic than ever. It might be reassuring to learn that the feast of the Holy Family was added to the Church's universal calendar because of Pope Leo XIII's concern for the state of family life—one hundred years ago! During this season of Christmas when families are everywhere, we welcome Emmanuel—the God who has pitched his tent among us.

La Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José

Las primeras palabras de un niño suelen ser motivo de emoción y alegría para los miembros de la familia. Hoy escuchamos las primeras palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio según Lucas. Y son desafiantes. "¿Por qué me buscan? ¿No sabían que debía estar en la casa de mi Padre?" Las palabras asombradas, sorprendidas y con gran ansiedad se utilizan para describir la prolongada visita de Jesús al Templo. ¿Qué familiares son esas

emociones para la mayoría de los padres! ¿Habían olvidado los padres de Jesús las palabras del ángel Gabriel o la profecía de Simeón? En el Evangelio de Lucas, este pasaje presagia el último viaje de Jesús a Jerusalén, donde vivirá su propia Pascua y volverá a estar "perdido" durante tres días. La historia de Ana en la primera lectura confirma la necesidad y la naturaleza de la confianza en la actividad de Dios en nuestras vidas. Parece claro que la atención fiel a la vida espiritual de una familia no garantiza que la vida esté libre de dificultades.

EMMANUEL: DIOS CON NOSOTROS

¿Se equivocó Tolstoi cuando escribió que todas las familias felices son iguales y que las infelices lo son cada una a su manera? Parece que lo contrario es igualmente cierto. Como las familias felices fomentan los talentos e intereses únicos de cada miembro, cada persona brilla según sus propias luces. La fe, los objetivos y los retos de una familia feliz serán los suyos propios. Las familias infelices, en cambio, pueden parecerse mucho en sus heridas, sus miedos y enfrentamientos, y su tendencia a dar interpretaciones negativas a las acciones de los demás.

Es tentador concluir que la vida familiar actual es más problemática que nunca. Puede ser tranquilizador saber que la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia se añadió al calendario universal de la Iglesia debido a la preocupación del Papa León XIII por el estado de la vida familiar, hace cien años. En este tiempo de Navidad, en el que las familias están por todas partes, damos la bienvenida al Emmanuel, el Dios que puesto su morada entre nosotros.

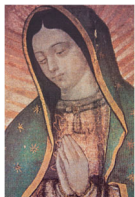

Fire safety: Close before you doze

If there is a fire in your home, there is a 900-degree difference between a closed door and an open one. Firefighters recommend that you always close doors before you and your children go to sleep. Remembering the simple phrase “Close before you doze” can help prevent toxic gasses and flames from getting in your room, giving firefighters more time to rescue you. Closing your children’s doors before bed is a quick, easy step to keep them safe — and provides an extra layer of security when coupled with working smoke alarms and a family safety plan. Los bomberos recomiendan que siempre cierre las puertas antes de que usted y sus hijos se vayan a dormir. Recordar la simple frase “Cierre antes de irse a dormir” puede ayudar a evitar que los gases tóxicos y las llamas entren en su habitación, lo que le da a los bomberos más tiempo para rescatarlo. Cerrar las puertas de sus hijos antes de acostarse es un paso rápido y fácil para mantenerlos seguros, y proporciona una capa adicional de seguridad cuando se combina con alarmas de humo que funcionan y un plan de seguridad familiar. Check Christmas presents for button batteries

Many parents will be spending the next few days and weeks assembling (and reassembling) their children’s gifts, and it’s important to be on the lookout for potential hazards, including button batteries. Button batteries are small, round discs used in anything from toys to key fobs to watches. If these batteries end up being swallowed or placed in a child’s nose or ears, they can cause serious damage — from electrical currents to tissue burns. Keep an eye on the power sources for the toys your children get this Christmas, and consider taking extra safety measures for anything with a button battery. Revise los regalos de Navidad para ver si hay baterías de botón

Muchos padres de familia pasarán los próximos días y semanas ensamblando (y reensamblando) los obsequios de sus hijos, y es importante estar atentos a los peligros potenciales, incluidas las baterías de botón. Las pilas de botón son discos pequeños y redondos que se utilizan en cualquier cosa, desde juguetes hasta llaveros electrónicos, conocidos como “key fobs” en inglés, y relojes. Si estas baterías terminan siendo tragadas o colocadas en la nariz o los oídos de un niño, pueden causar daños graves, desde corrientes eléctricas hasta quemaduras de tejidos. Esté atento a las fuentes de energía de los juguetes que sus hijos reciben esta Navidad y considere tomar medidas de seguridad adicionales para cualquier cosa que tenga una batería de botón. Understanding the dangers of carbon monoxide

Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas that is often undetected. More than 400 people in the U.S. die every year from unintentional carbon monoxide poisoning, and thousands more are hospitalized. When gas builds up in enclosed spaces, people or animals who breathe it in can be poisoned. Consider installing a battery-operated carbon monoxide detector, and have your furnace, water heater, and other gas or coal-burning appliances serviced regularly, along with your chimney. Comprender los peligros del monóxido de carbono

El monóxido de carbono es un gas inodoro e incoloro que a menudo no se detecta. Más de 400 personas en los Estados Unidos mueren cada año por envenenamiento involuntario por monóxido de carbono y miles más son hospitalizadas. Cuando el gas se acumula en espacios cerrados, las personas o los animales que lo respiran pueden envenenarse. Considere la instalación de un detector de monóxido de carbono que funcione con baterías y haga revisar su horno, calentador de agua y otros aparatos que funcionen con gas o carbón con regularidad, junto con su chimenea.
